

THE OPENER

Start with a hook. A funny line, a quote, an absurd statement, the punchline to a story you will tell. Start strong to grab the audiences attention.

THE PAST

Dive into the memory banks and pull a story or encapsulate the couple in a short, powerful story to help the audience learn a little about the couple.

THE PRESENT & FUTURE

A brief look at where the couple is now and how they evolved as you've known them. A mention of what lies ahead as they **start this new chapter.**

THE SIGNIFICANT OTHER

This is what most toasts miss! More than a mention of the significant other, this day is about **the two** people getting married (not you!).

THE BIG FINISH

Save the best for last. Leave the audience with a laugh, a tear jerker story or a heartfelt story. **Start strong, end stronger.**

Wedding Toasts 101

Take your toast from meh to memorable!

Begin with the five foundational pillars of wedding toasts, then elevate it further using our helpful Do's & Don'ts chart.

DO'S

DON'TS

Start with "If you don't know me by now, you're probably at the wrong wedding because I've been friends with the groom for 25 of his 27 years..."



Don't start with "for those who don't know me..."

Start strong with a great hook to grab the attention from the first word.



Don't start by fumbling with your mic, phone, tapping the mic, asking if they can hear you...

Be prepared! Have a printed copy. Screenshot the toast and keep your phone on airplane mode.



Don't admit you didn't prepare for your speech. You will lose all credibility immediately.

Be memorable. Make people laugh or bring them closer to tears. Find a silly joke or quote for a corny laugh.

(it works!)



Don't tell insider jokes. They are boring for 90% of your audience.

Short & strong.

Challenge yourself to tighten your toast into a 3 minute entertaining masterpiece.



Long & boring. If you have more to say to the couple, write it in a card, don't make the toast about you.

Practice your toast out loud. In the mirror, or better, to a friend to get feedback. Write it, then speak it to make sure it flows naturally.



Don't drink too much. Really. Even if you are nervous. Wait until after your speech!

Remember Nana. Think of telling your **toast to a sweet Nana**... does it pass the test?



Don't be cringy-worthy.
Reference ex-partners.
Stories with
drugs/drunk mishaps.
Criticize the couple.

Bring a glass to raise and say "raise your glass!". Set the glass on a table while you are talking, don't hold it.



Don't forget your glass to toast. Don't try and hold the glass as you toast.
